Enjoy the many events that celebrate the holidays in Scarborough and the region. Please have a safe and happy holiday season!





Project G.R.A.C.E. has several opportunities to ring in the season by helping neighbors in need.

Scarborough Terrace will host their annual bake sale the week of Thanksgiving: Monday, November 23 from 10am -3pm. Kind hearted seniors take over the kitchen at Scarborough Terrace to bake homemade treats to benefit Project G.R.A.C.E. Proceeds of the bake sale help to purchase children's clothing, hats, gloves, boots and jackets that will be distributed to local families.

Let Project G.R.A.C.E. match you with a local family with children. You'll be given a holiday wish list with items such as clothing, toys and games. Your gifts will need to be unwrapped and dropped off by Monday, December 14th.

Stock the pantry by bringing nutritious non-perishable foods to share among families who come up short every week. Staples like pasta, rice, beans, peanut butter & jelly, canned





meats, cereals & pancake mix, canned fruits & vegetables, are always needed. They also need grocery gift cards so that families can do their own shopping, fulfill special dietary needs, fill prescriptions, or get diapers, hygiene and personal care items, soaps and household paper products.

Host a Giving Tree to collect specific items that can help families all year long. Typical items include: hats & mittens, toys & games, soaps & personal hygiene items, gift cards for gas, food, or clothes.

Last, but not least, help families that struggle to pay for heating. You can donate to the Project G.R.A.C.E. Fuel Assistance Fund.
